THE SECURITY COUNCIL,

- P1. *Observing* the growing prevalence of misinformation, the disregard for objectivity, and the increasing use of emotional narratives to manipulate opinions, which denote a broader shift into a “post-truth era”,
- P2. *Deploring* the resulting loss of trust in global institutions and the deterioration of international relations and cooperation,

- O1. Encourages Member States to promote media literacy education in school curricula and public campaigns to empower citizens to critically evaluate information and reduce susceptibility to misinformation,
 - a. Calls for the conception of UN media literacy educational guidelines,
- O2. Recommends restrictions applied by the state upon artificial intelligence (AI) in media outlets to prevent the spread of misinformation,
 - a. Demands a watermark be placed on AI-generated images, videos, or audio content,
 - b. Requests the establishment of a digital integrity observatory to develop verification,
- O3. Encourages recognition that a post-truth world is damaging to citizens' integrity
- O4. Suggests the monitoring of the media by Member States, who should intervene when deemed suitable and when approved by the United Nations Department of Global Communication (UNDGC),
- O5. Supports neutral media platforms to provide factually accurate information and to prevent the spread of misinformation.
