THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL,

- P1. Acknowledging the varying timescales and degrees of effectiveness in responses to COVID-19 across UN member states,
- *P2. Recognising* the swift action taken by the United States to slow the spread of COVID-19 from the first months of 2020, including the formation of the White House Coronavirus Task Force (January) and the travel ban from China (February),
- P3. Regretting the hesitation of the World Health Organisation in its willingness to acknowledge the severity of the pandemic and to response,

- O1. <u>Requests</u> greater swiftness and international cooperation in the event of a future global health crisis,
- O2. <u>Reiterates</u> the importance of taking decisions during a global health crisis in the sole interests of protecting the health of the citizens rather than preserving political connections and alliances,
- O3. <u>Recommends</u> other member states, upon observation of the detrimental impact of the World Health Organisation's procrastination in dealing with COVID-19 as a demonstration of its incapability during a global health crisis, to withdraw funding from the organisation.
