THE DISARMAMENT AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY

- P1. *Recognising* the increasing integration of artificial intelligence into military systems and modern warfare,
- P2. *Concerned* by the absence of universally accepted frameworks governing the military application of artificial intelligence,
- P3. *Noting* the potential risks of unintended escalation and strategic instability arising from autonomous and semi-autonomous weapon systems,
- P4. *Emphasising* the principles of sovereign equality and non-interference as outlined in the Charter of the United Nations,

- O1. Encourages continued multilateral dialogue concerning the military application of artificial intelligence technologies,
- O2. Calls upon Member States to ensure the equal participation of all states in discussions regarding future frameworks governing military AI,
- O3. Supports efforts aimed at reducing the risk of unintended escalation and miscalculation arising from autonomous and semi-autonomous military systems through increased multilateral dialogue, information-sharing, and confidence-building measures between Member States,
- O4. Emphasises that any future international framework concerning military artificial intelligence must respect the principles of sovereignty, territorial integrity, and non-interference.
